## Preparing for the Inevitable.

O nvariably on any given day, evening or weekend, a call comes in from a distraught pet owner telling of the untimely death of his or her beloved pet. What makes it even more distressing is that the pet owner often does not know what to do once the pet has died. If the passing has occurred during normal business hours, the pet owners can usually call their veterinarians, who will then direct them to either bring the pets to their offices or take them directly to our pet crematory.

For those of you that have experienced this event, it can be heartbreaking, especially if the passing was sudden and unexpected.

Belspur Oaks Pet Crematory has devised a solution to this problem by creating "A Guide For Planning Ahead." This guide, which can be viewed and printed directly from our Web site, offers a pre-planning worksheet that, if executed properly, will put into place the pet owner's wishes for the final disposition of his or her pet when the animal has passed. Pre-planning eliminates additional anguish during a time that it is emotionally very painful.

In addition to this worksheet, information ranging from preparing for your pet's demise to dealing with the grieving process also is included. The guide also allows you to decide in advance on a meaningful way to permanently memorialize your pet, such as choosing an urn, casket or headstone.

It is recommended that, along with this planning guide, you include a quality photograph of your pet, the birth date or adoption date and the correct spelling of your pet's name.

Once the worksheet is completed, the pet owner can simply make copies and

give one to his or her veterinarian to place in the pet's file, so that when the time comes for the pet to pass, the stress of knowing what your wishes are will be minimized because all of the details are in place.

It also is suggested that the pet owner keep a copy of the worksheet at home in a file with other important paperwork, so that in the event that the information is needed, everyone in the household will know where to find it.

What does the "The Guide For Planning Ahead" cost the pet owner? Absolutely nothing. It has been developed and designed by Belspur Oaks to help the pet owner in the event of the pet's demise.

Filling out the guide is much like planning for the final transition of a human companion, which is usually done through a local funeral home.

It also will prevent any delays in taking care of your pet during the final disposition period, which can occur if the pet owner has not given any thought as to what should be done when the day finally arrives.
