Perhaps, most importantly, the book also underscores responsible pet ownership and the importance of making a lifelong commitment to any

animal one chooses to bring into his or her family.

Adopted from the Humane Society of Sarasota County, Sneaker lived a long life—a little more than 20 years—and was Barbara's "shadow" for so many important moments in her life, including the birth of her two children.

Barbara knows without a doubt that Sneaker chose her on the day she visited the animal shelter in Sarasota so many years ago. She was adamant about not bringing home a black cat—she admits that, at the time, she was a bit superstitious—but something about this cat, who had been given the name "Blackie," tugged at her heartstrings.

"I remember one of the volunteers telling me that Blackie had lost a litter of kittens, and I truly felt bad for her," Barbara recalls. "So, I played with her for a little while, but then we put her back in the caged area, and I continued my search."

Of course, Blackie wanted no part of that. She climbed up the wire "walls" of the caged area and cried loudly and continuously until Barbara had no choice but to take her out and hold her again.

This clearly was a relationship that was meant to be.

For Barbara, chronicling Sneaker's life in the pages of her new book has brought a mix of both happiness in remembering so many moments she and Sneaker enjoyed and heartache at the profound loss she still feels every day.

But by writing the book, Barbara also wanted to share her experience with others who are grieving the loss of their pets, many of whom she is in contact with every day.
